Surrey Young Carers

We have recently had two very positive assemblies with Jill Beaumont, the Education Officer for our area of the charity, Surrey Young Carers. She was able to explain to our children what it means to be a Young Carer, when there is somebody at home, often a parent or a sibling, who has extra needs that are long-term that in some way impacts on a child. She also spoke about the support that is available from Surrey Young Carers, which includes fun days out. As the Home School Link Worker at St Peter's, I am wanting to make sure that we know who all our Young Carers are, so that I can offer them support too. If you would like more information or think we may not be aware that your child is a Young Carer, please contact me via the School Office to have a chat. Rosemary Pointon, Home School Link Worker.

At St Peter's School we are developing our support for young carers. Young carers are young people who have caring roles for family members, often parents or siblings, or friends with physical or mental health problems or disabilities, or drug or alcohol problems.

If your family is affected by any of the issues mentioned above, and you and your son/daughter would like support, please contact me at the school through the school office or on 0758 7171230 so that we can arrange to talk. If no help is required just at this time, the school would still appreciate your sharing of any circumstances that may have an impact upon your child's education as they progress through the school. This will allow us to be aware and offer support as required. Anything you do tell us will be treated sensitively and will not be shared without your knowledge.

The school receives extra funding for each child who is eligible for free school meals, which can be put towards additional support for young carers. It is therefore important that children who are eligible are registered onto the Free School Meals register, even if they not need or want the meal. Ofsted

We are delighted with the outcomes of our Ofsted inspection and thank everyone who responded to the parent survey. We had a high response rate and feedback was overwhelmingly positive.

When the inspector arrived his first statement was: "Your website sells an exciting curriculum and a broad learning experience. I want to see how well this curriculum meets the needs of all pupils and enables them to achieve well across a range of subjects."

Throughout the day, the inspector went into all classrooms and met with a group of 24 children (who he selected randomly from the registers). The following quotes are lifted directly from the report.

- "The school is founded on clear Christian values and is wholly inclusive. It offers a warm welcome to all pupils and families, whatever their background or individual circumstances."
- "Pupils love coming to school. They enjoy the learning because teachers make learning interesting and relevant. These very positive attitudes to learning, underpinned by strong respectful relationships, help pupils to become confident and purposeful."
- "Senior leaders have designed a rich curriculum that opens a treasure chest of exciting learning opportunities for pupils."
- "Morale among staff is high"
- "Parents and carers are also overwhelmingly positive about the school. Many single out for praise the way leaders combine a care for individual pupils with a successful drive for pupils to achieve well academically."
- "Links with other schools from other countries, as well as those in their local area, help pupils to encounter people, ideas and situations that are very different from their own. This helps pupils to develop an understanding of their place in the world and to think about ways in which they can make a positive contribution. Pupils are actively involved with global issues such as fair trade and learn about environmental issues faced by themselves and others around the globe."
- "The curriculum is rich in opportunities for physical education, music and art, both in lessons and in the extensive out of school activities. Regular visits to the forest area of the school help them to learn at first-hand about a range of subjects."
- "Pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development is well catered for."

Yoga in School - an update



As you know this term, all classes have participated in two half hour yoga sessions. This is part of our focus on well-being and it has been a huge success. There is a lot of research to show that children who participate in yoga programmes in school show improvements in many areas, including: social interaction

social interaction attention span and ability to concentrate self-regulation and managing anger dealing with stress and anxiety confidence and self-esteem

Feedback from children and staff is overwhelmingly positive. The sessions take place in the classroom and are designed to give children strategies to regulate their emotions and develop resilience. Two parents have asked how the sessions sit with the school's Christian ethos, so it may help to give some detail. We would like to assure parents that the sessions are not yoga as it is typically portrayed in the media. There is no chanting or meditation – but there is calmness and a time to slow down. The sessions are adapted to suit the age group and include games, songs and teamwork exercises. Purposeful pauses are introduced to allow children to reflect.

The sessions are led by experienced yoga teacher, Natalie Perry and focus on four elements: Movement – developing flexibility, strength, balance and coordination Breathing – learning how the breath can be used to relax, energise or re-focus Mindfulness – focusing activities to increase self-awareness and manage emotions Relaxation – taking the opportunity to slow down and unwind

Comments from children:

- "I find it helps me to improve my posture."
- "It just gives me a little bit of time to think about all the good things that happen."
- "I didn't know I could stand still like that for so long it gives me control over my body."
- "I know it sounds funny, but I find I forget about anything that is worrying me."
- "I'd like to do it more often I really like the partner work."
- "It's a bit like PE but slower and you have to concentrate on what you're doing. I found I can balance on one leg for quite a while."

As you know, teachers are usually available on the playground at the end of the day. Urgent messages may be communicated via the office. Thank you for your understanding.
