Dear Parents

Thank you so much for your support this month with reading with your child at home. The impact of last month's message has been tremendous with so many more children reading and filling in their journals. Please continue to sign to say that you have read with your child. I am looking forward to seeing all the costumes next Thursday for World Book Day. Please do not spend money on costumes – keep it simple (and remember the weather too!)

I hope you have been able to make an appointment to speak with your child's teacher next week. It's not too late to sign up. The teacher will explain what your child is achieving in relation to age-related expectations and what progress they are making. There will also be some governors present over the two evenings should you wish to discuss anything with them.

I continue to monitor attendance every half term as I meet with the County's Education Welfare to discuss individual pupil's attendance. If you a re-

ceive a letter, please see it as a way of showing you that we want to support and work with you to increase your child's attendance and of course their success as they access the full curriculum.

Parent Readers – can you spare half an hour a week?

If any parent feels able to commit to two sessions a week (08:45- 09:00 – days to suit), we would love to hear from you. We have some KS2 children who would benefit from reading with an adult twice a week on a regular basis. We have been running this programme for four years now and it has been very successful. We really appreciate the time given to support other people's children, but it is very rewarding to see the children grow in confidence. Might your child be entitled to additional benefits?

If your financial circumstances have changed, you may find that your child is entitled to the Pupil Premium payment -this is money which goes to the school to support children in a variety of ways (financial, learning and wider experiences). It also entitles children to receive a meal at lunchtime at no cost

to the parent. Please pick up a form from the school office. It only requires your NI number, D of B and your signature. The process is totally confidential. Children will not be aware that they fall into this category, but the school will always do everything possible to ensure that the children do not miss out due to financial

circumstances. The funding continues through to secondary school, so it really is worth exploring for the sake of a simple online enquiry.

Plants for scent

Citrus, Daphne, Frangipani, Gardenia, Jasmine, Lilac, Mock Orange, Fragrant Vines Clematis, Honeysuckle, Jasmine, Passionflower, Sweet pea, Wisteria.

Fragrant Flowering Plants

Basil, Beebalm, Chamomile, Heliotrope, Hyacinth, Lavender, Lemonbalm, Lily, Mint, Peony, Pinks, Sage, Scented Geranium, Stock, Thyme, Violet.

Sensory plants for touch – Cape Jasmine, Cockscomb, Feather grass, Gay-feather, Globe Amaranth, Hare's Tale Grass, Lamb's ears, Lily, Love-lies-bleeding, Mullein, Obedient Plant, Pussy willow, Rose mallow, Squirrel-tail grass, Statice, Woolly thyme, Sensory plants for sound –large leafed plants, Animated Oats, Balloon flower, Chinese lantern plant, Honesty or Money Plant, Pearl Grass.

Y5 Air Quality Workshop



Year 5 have been lucky enough to take part in an important project as part of the Surrey Schools Air Quality Programme. This started with a workshop on pollution and an introduction to the collection of pollution data. The children were asked to place 10 diffusion tubes around the school and grounds, thinking particularly about where pollution might be higher, in order to measure the amount of NO2 (a pollutant) in the different areas. In 2 weeks time the children will be taking the tubes down and sending them to be analysed. They will report the results soon, and any actions that can be taken. Watch this space....

It has been another busy and very successful month of sport for St Peters. Firstly, we entered 2 teams at the Sportshall Indoor Athletics at Weydon along with 6 other schools. Our year 6 team fought very hard and came away with a brilliant second place – just narrowly missing county finals. Our year 6 boys won the soft javelin and placed 2nd in 5 other events. Next it was the turn of our younger children to represent the school at a year 3 football tournament. Healthy Schools Update

We are delighted to announce that this month we have achieved the Silver Healthy Schools award. This is because we have identified a healthy school project to work on over the next 2 years. After listening to pupil, staff and parent voice we are now working on making lunchtimes happier and healthier for all children. In September our Healthy Schools committee was set up. It consists of one child from each class from Years I to 6. We have been busy finding out what the children in our class like and dislike about the school dining hall. From the feedback, we have found that the children do not like the noise level or the amount of mess in the dining hall. We have been observing and were quite shocked by the number of children who did not eat all their lunch, or who made mess because they did not sit at the table properly or use their cutlery correctly. Our findings were shared in an assembly before half term. We have introduced a lunchtime award and children will be nominated by the lunchtime supervisors. This term we will be encouraging all children to sit properly and use their cutlery correctly. Please help us by supporting your child to improve this important skill while eating at home.
