We were delighted to hear just a few days ago, that St Peter's has been shortlisted as a finalist for the TES Schools Awards 2019 (International category). Having received the British Council's International Award in the Autumn, we had a lot of evidence already in place so thought it might be worth a try.

The application has to summarise the global learning which takes place across the curriculum and in our case, included the links with overseas schools, the communication with French pen pals, Ghana and all of the Fairtrade learning. Strands of global learning which underpin other subject areas were also included, such as the cookery which links with the countries studied in Geography and History and the Forest School which also includes constructing a model of the Alps.

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Schools from all over the world enter for this prestigious award; primary, secondary, independent, special and overseas so we sre thrilled to be a finalist. The winner will be announced on 21st June. Find out more by clicking on the link below.
