Dear Parents.

We are all looking forward to the special time of Advent which is fast approaching. The last three weeks of this term are always packed full of celebrations and preparations towards Christmas. All the children are practising hard for the various Christmas performances including the Advent Service (in school time next week) and the Carol Service which is on Monday 16th December in St Peter's church at 6pm. It is aimed at Key Stage 2 for their families and siblings. It would be wonderful to see all the Juniors take part in this traditional service of readings and carols.

A couple of reminders to you all from the Senior Leadership Team and Governors:

Staff Car park – this is a designated area for staff and blue badge holders to park. Everyday there is a different parent using the car park to turn around, park, drop off their child. It is dangerous to have children walking across the car park and it also blocks the road as staff cars have to wait for the parent to make their manoeuvre. It is also very disappointing when parents are rude to staff when they are challenged. We should all be role models to our children by showing respect to each other and for the rules.

Making an appointment with staff: please can parents speak to the class teacher first when you have a concern or worry. The appointment can be made through the school office. This is a vital first point of contact as the class teacher knows the most about your child. On the rare occasion matters are not resolved then an appointment can be made with the next most senior member of the team.

Farnham Christmas light Switch On

Thank you to parents who supported us by taking the time out to deliver their children who are in the Young Voices Choir and Junior Choir, to Gostrey Meadows on Saturday 23rd for the Farnham Christmas light switch on. The children sang Clip Clop Don't Stop! And Everybody Join in the Party, Little Drummer Boy and Silent Night.



We were delighted with the response to our presentations around our new resilience and wellbeing programme, Trick Box. Over the two sessions, two thirds of our families attended to find out more about the 'tricks' we are using in school to help pupils develop their own strategies for becoming more independent and resilient. The whole concept is based on looking for positive solutions rather than dwelling on a problem. It is underpinned by four key areas: Confidence. Calm. Communication. Creativity. The programme is starting in Early Years with a 'catch up' being delivered in other year groups. As a school we are hoping to develop a common language around which children will learn to understand that they have choices which will determine the outcome of any given situation. It sounds a bit 'adult', put like this, but the programme is taught through very simple visuals which come in the form of a pack of cards. All our staff are on board and as the year goes on, you will find that your child will become very familiar with the cards and strategies.



Many families bought a set of cards last week and we would encourage every family to buy a set. Although the children won't have covered all of the cards, they are reasonably self- explanatory and a great opener for a conversation with a child of any age, if things aren't going as well as expected. **Sets of cards are priced at £5 and are available from the office (Scopay or cash).** Please contact Mrs Marshall if you need financial support for this.

Please ask your child's teacher if you would like more information. From next term, we shall advise parents which tricks are being discussed in each year group. We are unable to send out the presentation but the following link should give you some idea of Trick Box.
