#### Mama Panya's Pancakes

Year I have been reading 'Mama Panya's Pancakes' by Mary and Rich Chamberlin as part of our learning. We decided to make Mama Panya's pancakes following her recipe in the book. The pancakes are typical Kenyan

pancakes made from flour, water, oil, chilli flakes and nutmeg and are quite spicy. Everyone tried them and many children loved them! It was great fun!

#### Fairtrade Gingerbread Heart Challenge

During the week before half term Early Years and Key Stage I took on a Fairtrade Gingerbread Challenge. We decided to make gingerbread hearts using as many Fairtrade ingredients as we could so we could sell them to other children at school for 50p to raise money for Fairtrade. The heart shape represented our care and support for Fairtrade farmers to enable them to have a fair living wage for the products they grow. We asked the children to consider giving the heart to someone they care about on Valentine's Day. Year R, Year I and Year 2 had a great time making the hearts following a Fairtrade recipe and using Fairtrade sugar, vanilla and honey. We made over 400 hearts which we decorated with a red ribbon and packaged in paper bags to look after the environment. The sale was run by our very organised and keen Fairtrade Committee. It was a huge success and we are very grateful for everyone's support. Thank you! The KS1 children raised around £200 from their gingerbread hearts! This is an amazing achievement for young children. The money will go to Traidcraft Exchange to support community projects for farmers.
