Photales arrives at St Peter's

Photales is a brilliant little App that runs on iPads and iPhones. It allows users to add voice recordings to their photo collection. You can then create compilations that join photos together, thus creating an audio/visual suite similar to a slideshow. The App produces very small mp4 video files that can then be played, shared and enjoyed by friends and family. The Photales App is really easy to use, it simply involves touching buttons and talking.

Taking photos and adding audio later is far less time consuming and less intrusive than taking video. It allows you to enjoy the moment more on holidays, trips, birthdays and special occasions and go back later and add your audio recordings.



Skype Session with French School in Cannes

Year Five pupils were able to put some of their French conversation skills into practice recently in a Skype session with one of link schools, Ecole Lochabaire in Cannes. It was a fantastic opportunity for children to meet the person they've been writing to and to find out about life in France, both in school and at home. It is exciting for the children to be able to communicate directly and in spite of elementary language skills, it is surprising how well they can communicate, particularly when it comes to sport and entertainment!

The reality is that there are currently too many primary school places in Farnham for the number of children. If you know anyone who is looking for a primary school place or is moving into the area, please direct them to our website and encourage them to visit.

Academic Achievement

The government statistics for KS2 SATS have just been published. This means that parents can see how the school compares with others locally and also how much progress children are making.

In summary, among local schools we had the second highest figure for Greater Depth achievement – this is awarded to children who have scored at a high level jointly across Reading, Writing and Maths. Our progress figures against prior attainment and a national benchmark, was above average in Reading and Maths and average in Writing (independent composition- not handwriting). We are constantly evaluating and developing our curriculum to ensure that all pupils make good progress.

Skype Session with German School

A further opportunity came up this week when the Etwinning Club were able to contact a school in Germany as part of an Eco project which they are involved in with several schools across Europe. The pupils were joined by the Global Committee and a couple of children from the KSI Geography Club. We lost the link a few times but we were able to introduce ourselves and share what we are doing in school to help the environment. The school is just inside Germany on the border with Strasbourg and our children were amazed to learn that the school is totally dual language- some pupils spoke in German, others in French (teacher translating into English) and that some pupils live in France and go into Germany daily for school! We recorded Jingle Bells for the school and they have sent us a German carol recording that they've made. We plan to organise more of these sessions which are a perfect way to connect with the world using the power of technology.
