READING/WRITING:

- Please also read other stories with your child for a minimum of 10 minutes a day.
 Please share a range of stories and information books.
- Please help your child to read/recognise the high frequency words list (attached)
- Please practise handwriting in their specific handwriting books. Ensure your child has the correct pinch grip. Please use the formation poems to aid correct formation.

MATHS/NUMBER



- Work on Maths Passports (children have them in their book bags) which teach basic number skills
- Play board games which involve counting
- Play games such as Hopscotch in the garden
- Look for opportunities to count/add/subtract around the home
