- Children should spend a minimum of 25 minutes a day reading aloud a book at their level. You will find that the Oxford
   Owl website has suitable e- books
- Please also read with your child for a minimum of 10 minutes a day. Please share a range of fiction and information books. Please make sure that you discuss the book with your child – focusing on the characters, plot and vocabulary. Comprehension is key.
- Please support your child to spell the words on the Y5/Y6 expected spellings list (attached). As well as being able to spell, children need to know the meaning of the words and be able to use them in context.
- Readiwriter Spelling a new list will be set on a Friday (NB this replaces
   Spellodrome - login via Mathletics)
- Comprehension tasks will be uploaded regularly.

### **MATHS**



- Work on Maths Passports which reinforce essential number skills
- Use Purple Mash to practise your tables all Y5 pupils need to know up to 12x fluently. You also need to know the corresponding division facts: (eg: 7x9=63/ 63÷7=9/63÷9=7)
- Use Topmarks.co.uk (Daily 10, Hit the Button) to practise
- Use Hit the Button for tables, halving, doubling and number bonds
- Mathletics will be set on a Friday please check regularly
- Please look for opportunities to practise time/weights and measure around the home.

#### **FOUNDATION LEARNING**

Where a project is mentioned, children can complete this in any way they choose. This could be a piece of artwork, a model or a piece of writing. Some children might even create a piece of music, a song or a poem!



Please create at least one of the following:

- Rivers collage (Art/Geography) You can use materials of your choice, and it can be as large as you like, but it must show the journey of a river.
- A model to demonstrate an aspect of Forces
- Produce a detailed storyboard sequence and create sound effects and/or music to enhance it – you can record this if you like, or perform it when you return to school.
