

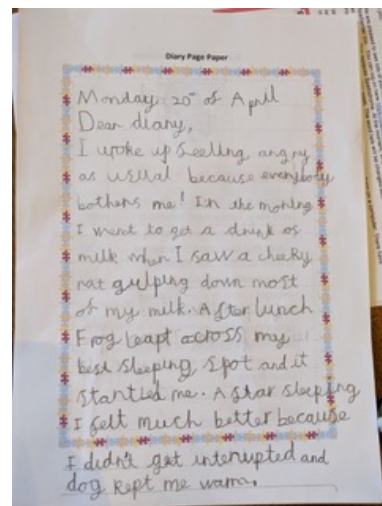
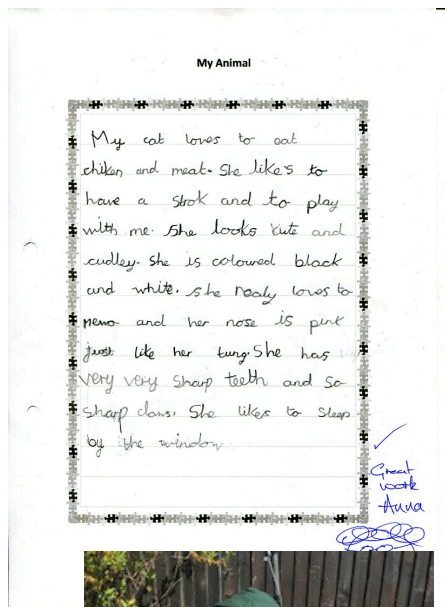

How are you all doing? We really miss your smiling faces and enquiring minds each day. We hope you have seen the video the staff made so you know we are thinking of you. We can see many of you have been busy with online learning and hope you are getting on well with the White Rose Maths lessons and other ideas we have shared. Next time you use Purple Mash, click the 'sharing' button at the top. We have set up a class display board so you can start to see some of the things you have been doing. It has been lovely to hear from lots of you this week via e-mail. If you haven't already, please choose one activity you have done at home recently that you are proud of and share it with us. We would really like to know you are having fun and we love seeing all the creative ideas you have to keep busy. These are some examples of what you have been up to.



Here are some other suggestions of more practical activities you might like to try this week.

Creative Challenge	Choose a word or message that you would like to share with the class. Display the word as a picture, or with objects (similar to our pictures at the beginning of the letter). Ask someone to take a photo of you with your word/message and email it to your teacher. We would like to use the images to make a short video to share with you all. If you can do this by Tuesday 12 th May, we will try and compile something.
Reading Dens	We hope you are finding plenty of time to enjoy sharing books. Where do you like to read? This week, why not make a reading den where you can go to enjoy your favourite books. We would love to see a photo of your den, or maybe you could share a book review of a book you have read recently. You could complete a book review on Purple Mash, or write it out by hand.
Science 	How are you getting on with the St Peter's Challenge? Can you recognise and name five different flowers? This week, you could see how many different types of tree you can identify. We have included an identification sheet in the Week 5 folder you could use to help.
RE 	This term we would have been thinking about the question 'Why do Christians go to church?' Think about the times you have been to church. Do you remember the Harvest service we held at St Peter's Church in the autumn? Have you ever been to a baptism or a wedding? Maybe you attend a church regularly, or for a special occasion or at Christmas. Talk with a grown up about when you have been to church. You might want to watch this short video https://request.org.uk/restart/2015/01/12/tour-of-a-church/ If you have been baptised, perhaps you could talk with your family about the service, or look at some photos from the special day.
Throwing & Catching Challenge 	Step 1 – Throw a ball in the air and try to catch it without dropping it. See if you can do it 20 times. Can you do any more than that? Can you change hands? Step 2 – Can you add a clap whilst the ball is in the air? Can you add 2 or more claps? Step 3 – Throw the ball in the air, let it bounce then catch it. Step 4 – Throw the ball in the air, turn around and catch it. Be careful, don't get too dizzy! Step 5 – Throw the ball in the air, can you clap under one leg before catching it? Can you clap under both legs before catching it? **If you do not have a ball at home that you can use, maybe use a pair of socks balled up or a small teddy. Can you make up any new challenges to do with a ball?

Remember, we would love to hear how you are doing so send us one piece of learning you are proud of. Don't forget to send a photo of you with a message if you would like us to include it in a class video.
