This week:

<u>Maths:</u> Please continue with the White Rose Home Learning. We are also setting Mathletics each week for you to complete. Please try and complete these as we have noticed not everyone is logging in. Once you have finished the set work you can find some problem-solving activities under the explore tab at the top of the page. We have chosen specific ones for you to try and there is also space to show your workings or send us a message if you are stuck.

<u>English</u>: Please continue with the Hamilton Trust Home Learning. Don't forget to practise your spellings on Readiwriter. We have noticed that not all of you are practicing these. Please try and have a go as there are some good games to play. Have a go at writing a book review on Purple Mash and uploading it onto the Display Board or blog so that we can all see.

<u>Science</u>: How have the science investigations gone? Isobel tested the parachutes and found the bin liner worked best. What did you find, what was the best material for your parachute? Henry has sat in his garden and noticed lots of nature around him. We are looking forward to seeing any work on life cycles.

<u>History:</u> Was Robin Hood real? What did you decide? We have added another lesson about Crime and Punishment. Look through the power point attached, answer the questions and match the key words with their meanings. Choose worksheet 1a, 1b or 1c. Cut up the sorting cards and try and match up the crime, how it was detected and the punishment. Then write a few sentences about how crime and punishment has changed or stayed the same over time.

**R.E.:** Have a look at the power point from last week and create a piece of art about the Apostles Creed. We would love to see it by the end of the week.

<u>Art:</u> Texture Treasure Hunt. You could create a frottage patchwork from rubbings of textured objects which you find around your home. You will need a pencil and paper. Fold your piece of paper 4 times. Look around your house or outside in the garden and find different objects and surfaces to take a rubbing. Fill each box on your sheet with a different rubbing. Add lines or patchwork stitches if you like:
