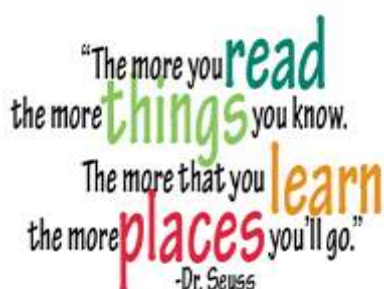

YEAR 4

ENGLISH



- Complete the Hamilton English lessons.
- Children should spend a minimum of 20 minutes a day reading aloud – a book at their level.
- Please make sure that you discuss the book with your child – focusing on the characters, plot and vocabulary.
- **Readiwriter Spelling** - a new list will be set on a Friday (NB this replaces **Spellodrome** – login via Mathletics)

We have noticed that very few children are completing their spellings. Please, if you can, the children need to keep up with this and it is something they should be able to do on their own, online.

MATHS



- We have changed to the White Rose maths lessons. Complete the Maths Summer term lessons **which are on the school website.**
- Complete the **Mathletics reasoning and problem solving questions** on Mathletics. You **must** show your working out.
- **We look at and reply to ALL your answers!** Sometimes we may ask you to try again.
- **If you can't do it then please ask for help instead of pressing the 'answer' button.**
- **If you have completed your Maths Passports then ask us for your next one.**
- Use Purple Mash to practise your tables – all Y4 pupils need to know up to 12x fluently
- Use Topmarks.co.uk (Daily 10, Hit the Button) to practise halving, doubling, number bonds, multiplication and division.

SCIENCE



This half term you are going to become an expert on 'what makes a living thing'. On a piece of paper, write down what you think makes a living thing. Now go through the Science ppt.

RE LEARNING



This half term we will explore what life is like as a Sikh. Look at the images of Sikh artefacts on the ppt. What do you think each one is for and what does it represent? Make a list of questions you would like to ask about the Sikh faith.

FOUNDATION LEARNING

Where a project is mentioned, children can complete this in any way they choose. This could be a piece of artwork, a model or a piece of writing. Some children might even create a piece of music, a song or a poem!



Art

This half term we are looking at Indian art. Have you seen any Indian art or do you know any Indian artists? Indian painting has a very long and involved history. There have been many different painting styles throughout the years in India. The earliest Indian paintings were painted on rocks and were often painted in natural caves around the country. Indian paintings are classed into two genres: murals and miniatures. Look at the Art ppt to see the differences between the two. This week we will explore seven well-known styles of historical Indian paintings; Mughal painting, Rajput painting, Mysore painting, Tanjore painting, Kangra painting, Madhubani painting and Pattachitra. Look at the colours, patterns and images you can see in the examples. What is common in all of the paintings? Choose one of the painting activities at the end of the ppt. We will put together all your paintings to create a class mural.

Geography

Look at the Geography ppt. Define a 'port'. Look at different types of ports in the UK and around the world.
