Afterwards, write a paragraph explaining how crime and punishment had changed from the Norman period to the Tudor period, and what had stayed the same.

**Art** – Please have a go at the lesson called: Optical Illusions and using shading to show form. You will learn how to shade in to show how an object is three- dimensional.
