







Here are some of the fun things you have shared with us since our last update.

<p>Reading for Pleasure</p> 	<p>Enjoying books with your family, or reading a book yourself is the best thing you can do. Have a look at the Sharing the Love of reading challenges. <p>Bird Spotting</p> 	<p>We know lots of you have been enjoying spotting the birds in your garden. Can you identify and name 5 different birds yet? Why not have a go at making a bird feeder or bird house for your feathered visitors? Look in this week's folder for some instructions you could follow to make either.</p>

<p>Send someone a hug</p> 	<p>Who are you missing during lockdown? The hardest thing for many of us during this has been not being able to see our family or friends. Follow the instructions in the folder on how to send a hug to someone special. Write a message to a friend or a family member and either pop it in the post box, or walk to their house and post it through the letterbox. Think carefully about what you might say to them. What would make them feel happy?</p>
<p>Observation skills</p> 	<p>Two challenges this week...</p> <p>Can you complete the colour Scavenger Hunt? How many things can you find of each colour of the rainbow? Try the scavenger hunt indoors and then outside. Which colours are easy or hard to find? Are some easier to find indoors than outside?</p> <p>Then, choose an object to draw. It could be inside or outside. You could draw the whole object or just part of it. Look carefully at the shapes you can see. How carefully can you draw the object? Can someone in your family guess what you have drawn?</p>
<p>Geography</p> 	<p>Where in the world do you live? Do you know your address? How is an address made up? Do you know the difference between a town, a country and a continent? Type in your address or postcard and watch as you zoom in from space to where you live. Can you spot any other places you recognise? https://www.google.co.uk/earth/</p> <p>Have a go at writing your home address out on an envelope or postcard. Make sure you start each part of the address on a new line and remember capital letters for place names. You might even want to put a stamp on the envelope, go for a walk and post your letter back home. How many days will it take to get back to you?
