<p>Reading for Pleasure</p> 	<p>In the week 9 folder you will find Top Ten Storytimes to Enjoy. It is a list of recommended stories with links to an audio version – many of which are read by the author of the book.</p> <p>Once you have enjoyed the stories, why not choose one of your favourite stories to read aloud. You could even try recording yourself reading the story. Maybe you could add some sound effects!</p>
<p>Science</p> 	<p>Have a go at the scavenger hunt.</p> <p>Can you plan a scavenger hunt of your own for someone else to complete?</p>

<p>RE</p> 	<p>Watch these short video clips (What a wonderful world) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bkTLIO2zanM and (Things that make you say 'Wow') https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9vs1nwfsTDM</p> <p>What in our world makes you say 'wow' and express wonder? How might these things cause someone to think about God?</p> <p>Can you create a piece of artwork that shows something that makes you say 'wow' or show wonder?</p>
<p>Geography</p> 	<p>Take a look at the map in the Week 9 folder of Wrecclesham. Can you find where you live? What other places can you find (e.g. our school, the recreation ground, the church, the Post Office, the railway line)?</p> <p>You might like to use the map to work out a route to walk around our local area, or maybe you could make your own map. This could be a map of your house or garden, or an imaginary map. Why not create a town using lego or construction and draw a map of it?</p>
