




<p>Science Challenge</p> 	<p>What do animals need to stay alive? How important is the right food? Animals that eat meat are called carnivores. Animals that eat only plants are called herbivores and animals that eat both meat and plants are called omnivores. <p>History Challenge</p> 	<p>This week we are trying to answer the question ' Where is the best place to build a castle? '. Imagine you are King William the Conqueror's castle builders.
