Science	We are going to be thinking about the characteristics of living things. How do we tell if something is alive? <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zg7s39q</u> Think about something. Is it living, was it once living, has it never been alive? We have included a sheet with pictures that you might like to discuss and sort, but it would be even better if you were to write the 3 headings and see how many items you can find to list under each heading.
RE	Did you think about God's World and what makes you say 'Wow'? The children in school have been painting pictures to show their thoughts. This week we will begin to think about how Christians worship. Part of worship is listening to readings from The Bible. What do you know about the Bible? Wellbeing Jigsaw	Create an 'All about you' jigsaw puzzle. You could use photos, pictures from newspapers and magazines and your own drawings. Take a look at the Wellbeing Jigsaw for some ideas of what you might include on your jigsaw.
