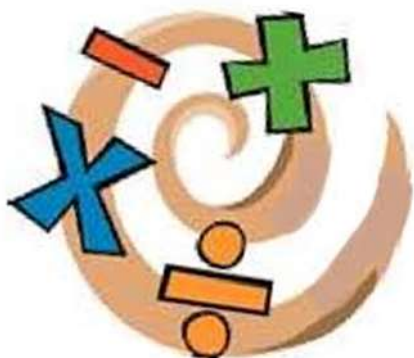
### ENGLISH

### Art

Do you know what henna is? Do you know why it is used in India? Henna is a small shrub that grows in India and in other places around the world. The leaves from the henna plant are crushed into powder and mixed with water and lemon juice to make a paste which is then used. Indian people call this tattoo method mehndi. When a mehndi design has been created it is left to dry and then rubbed off to reveal a temporary tattoo. Feet, legs, arms and hands are usually decorated because these body parts are seen the most when Indian women wear traditional clothing and wedding dresses. Mehndi patterns are often symmetrical. Look at the examples of mehndi on the art ppt.

You will be creating your own mehndi pattern using the hand and/or foot templates.
