



This is a coastal landform, a point of land usually high and often with a sheer drop, that extends into a body of water. It is a type of promontory.

This is a partially enclosed coastal body of brackish water (mixture of sea water and fresh water) with one or more rivers or streams flowing into it, and with a free connection to the open sea.

This is a vertical, or nearly vertical, rock exposure. These are formed as erosion landforms by the processes of weathering and erosion.

This is any broad expanse of land with a general low level.

This is a fringe of land at the edge of a large body of water. This is the salty water that covers a large part of the surface of the earth.

This is a flowing, moving stream of water, usually freshwater, flowing towards an ocean, sea or lake.
