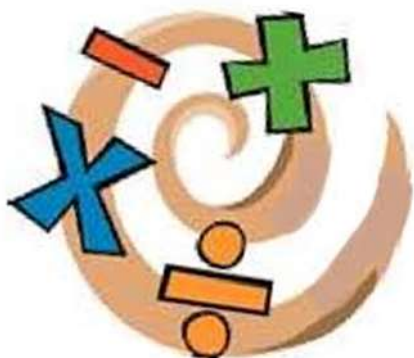
ENGLISH

- Complete the Hamilton English lessons.
- Children should spend a minimum of 20 minutes a day reading aloud – a book at their level.
- Please make sure that you discuss the book with your child – focusing on the characters, plot and vocabulary.
- **Readiwriter Spelling** - a new list will be set on a Friday (NB this replaces **Spellodrome** – login via Mathletics)

We have noticed that very few children are completing their spellings. Please, if you can, the children need to keep up with this and it is something they should be able to do on their own, online.

MATHS



- We have changed to the White Rose maths lessons. Complete the Maths Summer term lessons **which are on the school website**.
- Complete the **Mathletics reasoning and problem solving questions** on Mathletics. You **must** show your working out.
- **We look at and reply to ALL your answers!** Sometimes we may ask you to try again.
- **If you can't do it then please ask for help instead of pressing the 'answer' button.**
- **If you have completed your Maths Passports then ask us for your next one.**
- Use Purple Mash to practise your tables – all Y4 pupils need to know up to 12x fluently
- Use Topmarks.co.uk (Daily 10, Hit the Button) to practise halving, doubling, number bonds, multiplication and division.

SCIENCE



Remember the dichotomous keys we made last week? In order to use classification keys we need to closely observe living things and make scientific sketches of them. Watch the video clip about Levon Biss. You are now going to create a large scale observational drawing. Look at the Science ppt.

RE LEARNING



Over the next two lessons we would like you to investigate the significance of the Gurdwara for Sikhs and then create your own. Look at the RE ppt.

FOUNDATION LEARNING

Where a project is mentioned, children can complete this in any way they choose. This could be a piece of artwork, a model or a piece of writing. Some children might even create a piece of music, a song or a poem!



Art

Art ppt – look at the piece of Indian fabric that was created using the block-printing technique. Block-printing has been used in India since the 12th century. Look at the pictures of block stamps. They are called bunta and are used to print the patterns on the fabric by hand. Look at the picture of an Indian man using a block stamp to print fabric. The printing goes from left to right and the block needs to be pressed down hard. Look at some more pictures of block-printed fabric. What shapes and colours are used and how many blocks are used to make the patterns? Following the steps on the ppt, make a block stamp and use it to print onto fabric. Then try the extra challenge ideas. Send in a photo of your patterned fabric.

Geography

Find out as many facts about Portsmouth as you can. Look at lesson 4 on the Geography ppt.
