

To learn about Frida Kahlo and analyse some of her work.










This is Frida Kahlo.

She was a Mexican painter who became one of the most successful Latin American artists in history.

Was she confident or shy?








Kahlo was born in 1907. Her father was German and her mother was Mexican. When Kahlo was six years old she contracted polio which caused her right leg to grow thinner than her left leg. She wore long skirts for the rest of her life to cover this.

Did you know that as an adult Kahlo lied about her age? She did it so that her birthday was linked to the Mexican revolution.








At the age of 18 Kahlo was involved in a serious bus accident. She was badly injured and it meant she had to stay in bed for nine months! However this was what began her painting career. They made her an easel which she could use while still in bed and, while recovering, she

passed the time by painting.

The accident meant that Kahlo had to have lots of operations and she suffered from back pain for most of her life.









