# **Reception Applications for September 2017**

Surrey County Council has asked us to remind parents that the closing date for Reception and Junior applications for September 2017 entry is 15 January 2017.

We especially welcome online applications, however parents can also request a paper application form or seek impartial help in completing an application via the Surrey Schools & Childcare Service (0300 200 1004). Applications received after the closing date without good reason will be treated as late and will not be considered until all on time applications have been processed. This may jeopardise the chance of a parent being offered one of their preferred schools for their child.

#### **Head lice**

Then after treatment thoroughly comb their hair with a nit comb. And keep checking for the next 7-10 days using plenty of conditioner and the nit comb.

We are looking for foster carers for children aged 0-18, for supported lodgings providers for young people aged 16-21, and Short Breaks carers for disabled children. Whether you are married or single, male or female, are straight or gay, do or don't have your own children, rent or own your home, work or don't work, we would love to hear from you.
