Helping your child

Please continue to read with your child as many times as you can in a week. Reading opens up the doors to all the other learning. Even if your child is fluent there is still such pleasure to be gained from reading aloud together. Don't forget to read to your child too to model how to change your voice at punctuation and for different characters. Also the point of reading to a child is to choose a text they couldn't read themselves but will still enjoy. Please could you help your child to spell their full name and when ready to learn their date of birth. Children in the Juniors often have to fill these details in on tests that get sent away and it gives them greater confidence when they know these details. Thank you.

Staff Car Park

It is essential that parents do not use this car park at any time unless accessing the disabled bays. It is in constant use and we now have 60 members of staff who require the spaces. Sadly parents have been parking during breakfast drop off which can cause congestion when staff are arriving for school.

Pick up in the playground

This is getting easier now that children have a clear space to line up and parents are standing back. Please encourage your children to be independent and line up and enter the school building with their class and teacher. Parents please remain outside the buildings unless you have an appointment. With 428 children entering the school at 8.40am we need to ensure parents and buggies are outside. Thank you so much for your co-operation.

PE and SPORTS

We have a busy schedule of sporting fixtures over the next year which will include both KS1 and KS2 children. This year we have appointed Core Sports to coach our football and netball squads to ensure that the children are ready to meet the competition. At away games, a Core Sports coach will attend along with a member of St Peter's staff. There are a few rugby festivals scheduled and to support this Mr Daniel will run a Thursday lunchtime club which will rotate children according to the upcoming events (girls/boys/age groups). Thank you in advance to parents who help with transport for away games. It would not be possible without you.

The district Cross Country is on Saturday October 17th and we hope to field a large team across KS2. Training takes place on Wednesday lunchtimes but the daily mile run also contributes to children's running stamina. Aside from the competitive spirit of this event (and we hope to be working our way up the field), it is also a great community event bringing Farnham families together.

There are discussions about competition in other sports and we shall keep children and parents informed as more opportunities are confirmed within our network of schools.

There is also our class curriculum PE; all children are entitled to two hours of PE a week. During these lessons children learn new skills which can be applied to all sports and also learn to work together in teams.

Artsmark

You may be aware that we are on our journey to achieve the nationally accredited Artsmark. This requires us to set out our vision for The Arts in the school. As well as the visual arts, this includes performance, music, dance and drama. We are challenged to show how we incorporate the Arts into the wider curriculum — an example would be making Anglo Saxon jewellery from clay (linking History) or reconstructing a Jewish Sukkot in the Forest area to complement RE. We also need to demonstrate our links with the community on a local, national and global plane. Our History/Art project with the Farnham Pottery is a perfect example of how the Arts are becoming integrated into the curriculum. We have already started to make links across the Arts with Weydon School. Over the past year, the children have attended workshops at The Maltings, sung in concerts and played in orchestras alongside children from other schools. Y6 visited London's Globe Theatre and then performed Shakespeare's Tempest for parents. Our link school in Ghana sent us some beautiful aprons made by their older pupils using traditional Ghanaian designs. These are just a few of the experiences which contribute to an Arts rich curriculum which of course, we must ensure is sustainable.



Summary of the SDP (School Development Plan) which shows what the school will be working on over this academic year.

SDP 2016-2017 Summary

Leadership and management

- I. Write an IT strategy which supports the computing curriculum and enhances all areas of the curriculum. Assessment for computing to be consistent across the school.
- 2. To create a clear data set each term which can be understood and interpreted quickly by teachers, governors and the Local Authority.
- 3. The governors will formulate a clear action plan which supports the strategic direction of the school.
- 4. Decide by January 2017 whether the school will join or form an academy or not.

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment

- 5. To ensure children can respond in written format to comprehension questions using information from the high quality text. Children are able to explore and understand the deeper meanings within a text.
- 6. Conduct a 360° review of the Collins maths scheme to ensure that the curriculum has adequate progression and teacher's assessment aids planning. Standards at the end of KS to be in line with Surrey.

- 7. Embed a grammar and spelling scheme which ensures progressions through the school in order to raise standards in English.
- 8. To embed Learning Ladders in English and Maths in years I-6 and to adjust the use of the booklets according to age of child.
- 9. Conduct a 360° review of the science teaching, planning and assessment. Within this, review the Collins scheme and the whole school's SOW. Begin assessment using Learning Ladders. Ensure the SOW prepares children for the new, end of KS tests.
- 10. Teachers to focus on their questioning techniques and to make clear links across subjects and concepts (eg; global/ fairtrade/SMSC & British Values)
- 11. To develop the teachers' use of thinking skills Blooms and Guy Claxton and Carol Dweck mindset work to further improve independence and children's thinking and teachers' expectations
- 12. RE embed the new curriculum include more music/art and drama to express learning
- 13. To ensure the Art and DT new curriculum is challenging, inspiring and delivering high quality outcomes embedded
- 14. To provide the children with a high quality outdoor learning experience which will enable teachers to raise standards by providing hands on, cross curricular learning opportunities.
- 15. Achieve the Green flag award by July 2017
- 16. Achieve the Artsmark by July 2017
- 17. Create a consistent approach to assessing the foundation subjects.
- 18. Work towards gaining International Award

Personal development, behaviour and welfare

- 19. Achieve the Healthy Schools Award by May 2017
- 20. Sustain the Golden Mile challenge to enhance children's well-being.

2017-2020

- 21. Utilise The Bungalow building to be effective both educationally and financially
- 22. Produce a staffing structure for two years which includes specialist PPA teaching and SCITT placements.
- 23. Continue academy plans.
- 24. CPD for music and computing (2017) computing and French (2018) French, Art and DT (2019)
