# SIAMS Inspection - outstanding in all four areas (including teaching)

Thank you so much to the support you gave us for this inspection. The inspector was most impressed with everything that she saw and felt that the school's own Self Evaluation was absolutely spot on. She met with parents, staff, governors and children and every group endorsed our evaluations. We are encouraged that our teaching and learning, albeit in one subject, was judged to be outstanding. We have come so far even since our 2014 Ofsted inspection and we are now on a mission to ensure that these exceptionally high standards are carried through into all subject areas.

## Public Access Defibrillator

On Monday we saw the launch of our Public Access Defibrillator which is situated in a yellow cabinet, on the fence outside the main school gate. This is for emergency use and Mrs Jo Michaelides led two Information and Awareness sessions for parents, staff and neighbours on how to carry out CPR and how to use a defibrillator. Following funding from the British Heart Foundation and from our own PTFA, the defibrillator and cabinet were officially opened by the Mayor of Farnham. Local councillors and the families of individuals affected by cardiac arrest were also invited to attend. Over 70 people attended the sessions this week and we are hoping to make these an annual event, which will complement the HeartStart training given to all Year 6 pupils. #### Parent Morning Reading Programme

This is now into its second year and is a very successful support programme for individual children. We are so grateful to the 16 parents who volunteer 15 minutes twice a week to read with an individual child. We do always have children who would benefit from this programme and would like to recruit more parent readers to start in January.

## **Extended Library Opening**

Do remember that the school library will be open from 3:15-3:40 on Tuesday/Wednesday and Thursday. These slots will be for parents to assist their child in choosing a library book. All books must be scanned out on the library system. We would appreciate your co-operation in ensuring that the library is left tidy at the end of each session. Once again, we are thankful to have the support of volunteer parents who are enabling this to happen.

#### St Peter's Church

You may not have heard that St Peter's Church will be closed for several months for refurbishment. In the interim period, services will take place in the school hall. This is a wonderful opportunity to extend our welcome to the wider community. All school services will also be in the hall during the closure period.

#### Christmas Collection: Step by Step

"Empowering homeless people and those facing adversity to achieve their full potential."

This year we have decided to support the Aldershot based charity Step by Step. Many of you will know this organisation which supports teenagers and young adults who are homeless in this area. The collection will be for shoeboxes filled with toiletries and small gifts. We shall send out a list of suitable items but have been asked to point out that there are more young men than women who need their support. A surprising number of young people do end up homeless for a variety reasons, often relating to personal problems or family circumstances. Step by Step supports these young people in many ways and helps them to settle back into the community and feel valued again.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

Well done to all the children who have remembered to log how they travel to school each morning in their classroom. This month we have started awarding badges to the children who regularly travel to school in a 'green' way (walk, cycle, scoot). As a school, we have set the target of 15+ green trips to school per month. We appreciate that many families are unable to walk the whole way to school, either because of the distance or due to work commitments, so they are encouraged to 'Park and Stride' which also counts as a green way. Park and Stride means parking a distance away from the school and walking for 10-minutes or so, thus alleviating congestion near the school and gaining some health benefits for you and your family.
