As always, the second half term has been frantic with various sporting activities and school trips. For the first time this year our older pupils took a leading role in organising the inclusive Sports afternoon. We shall certainly be repeating this as they did an amazing job, encouraging the younger pupils and keeping everything running to time. Sports Morning is also a highlight of the school calendar; we hope you enjoyed watching the children represent their House in both a competitive and collaborative style! Ms Dawson has now selected the team for The District Sports to be held at the Aldershot Military Stadium – the final event of the sporting calendar.

This morning we held our annual St Peter's Day Service. It was also Rev Jacqueline's first school service in the church. The sun was streaming in through the stained -glass windows, there was a welcome breeze coming in through the open doors and the children's singing (accompanied by the organ) really raised the roof! We have had so much positive feedback from parents and parishioners. It was wonderful to be together as a school community in such beautiful and peaceful surroundings.

Last week was National Feelgood Week for schools and we were fortunate to be able to organise classroom -based yoga lessons for all classes. Natalie Perry led the sessions which have had very positive feedback from pupils and staff. We are committed to helping children to manage their emotions and develop resilience, and we can now begin to practise these techniques at appropriate times in the school day. During that week, our Y6 pupils also completed their Bike-ability Course which gives them the skills and confidence to ride their bikes on the road.

Evaluating some of the learning from this year, we have submitted applications for the SportsMark Gold and for the full accreditation for the International Award. We should have more news before we break up. Looking ahead, next week is The Summer Fair (Ipm- 4pm). Please come along with family and friends – the Fair is an occasion to experience St Peter's at its best.
