Earrings

A reminder to all parents that children are not permitted to wear earrings on school site at any time (this includes mufti days). They are not allowed to wear tape over earrings either. This is a health and safety rule and follows Local Authority guidelines. We always advise families to book piercings on the first day of the summer holidays so they can heal and return to school in September without them.

Drop off

The drop off zone works really well from 8.30 – 8.40am and relies on parent volunteers. If you feel you can offer a morning to help we would be really grateful. Please let the office know if you are available. It works much better when we have two people on duty. Also, we ask all passengers to be ready to leave the car with their belongings as quickly as possible in order to ensure a fluid transition of cars. Adults will always ensure your child enters the gates safely.

Drop off times

Thank you to families for wearing masks and following our one way pedestrian system. The bell goes to move into class at 08.40am. It is essential that all children are in line ready to move into class at that time because support groups and interventions begin at 08.45am, before the first lesson at 9am. Teaching assistants and other staff members need to be ready for their groups which are often focusing on filling gaps resulting from two lockdowns. If staff have to wait for children who are late to arrive, it does impact others' learning. Many thanks for your support on this.

Masks

We are more than happy for children to wear masks in school if they so wish. However, we have a new fashion accessory which seems to have slipped in whereby children are wearing snoods and scarfs around their necks all day but not using them as a mask. Please ensure your child wears only the school uniform and a face mask if they choose.

Clubs

We have many clubs running both before and after school and at lunchtime. It is great that so many of our pupils are so enthusiastic and sociable. Please could you remind your child to thank the person running the club each time. It is also important that if your child cannot attend for any reason, that you let the office know. If we don't know that a child isn't coming (and they were in school) time is wasted trying to find out whether they are lost on site or if they've gone home with the wrong person etc. This has a knock- on effect on everyone else in the club. We would ask parents that if their child wants to 'give up' a club that they have chosen to join, that you try to speak to the person running the club. It is important for the adult to know why a child wishes to stop (as it may be easy to sort) but perseverance is also a life skill. Staff sometimes hear children saying: 'I quit'. Giving up is the easiest thing in the world to do, but it doesn't develop resilience or self-confidence. With a different approach or a bit more information, most situations can be resolved or improved.

Clubs - missed sessions

All Spring term clubs are now up and running and the children are enjoying the wide range of clubs on offer. Please note school-run clubs are scheduled to run for eight weeks this term, leaving one week for parents' consultations and one week at the end of the term to make up for any missed sessions. Reminders will be sent out for this.

Clubs run directly by external providers (tennis, art, judo, CM Sports, chess) have their own schedule.

Young voices

Mrs Cobb has a wonderfully large choir of children from YR, Y1 and Y2.

On a Tuesday during lunchtime, she parades the playground with her sign to remind children to come to the rehearsal. The teachers also remind them before they dismiss for lunch. However, many children are not attending. As a parent, you may like to put a note in their packed lunch box or remind them before school that day. We are aware that you are paying for the club but with 58 members, Mrs Cobb is unable to go out and chase the children. We can't wait to hear them once they have learnt their songs.

School items

Please make sure your child comes to school with all the items they need for their school day (PE kit, lunch, book bag, musical instruments, forest school kit etc). We aim to make children independent and responsible for their own items, as well as minimise professional time lost delivering items. Please support the school with this.

Judo

If your child no longer does judo at school but you still have the judo kit at home, please return it to the school office with your child's name, so Dave Johnston can update his rental list, thank you.

New charges

With immediate effect, in line with guidance from Surrey County Council, the school will make a charge to parents in the following situations:

- Requests to provide reports for independent schools – in order to support the admissions process, St Peter's is often asked to complete forms/reports. There will now be a charge of £45 per request.
- Request to countersign passport or visa applications – A charge of £10 per request.

Car emissions

It has been noticed that many parents are arriving very early for pick up and leaving their car engines running. Sometimes for up to 20 minutes. You may remember a while back our children ran a project to remind car drivers to cut their engines to cut emissions. An idling engine can **produce up to twice as many exhaust emissions as an engine in motion**. Whilst we appreciate you may like to get here early to park, please switch your engines off for the sake of neighbours and for the environment., thank you.
