**Governors column** 



Hi, I am Neil Ambrose, a Foundation (Diocesan) Governor appointed in October 2016. I am the Co-Chair alongside Bart Caines, a role that we both took on in 2021. When I first joined the Governing Body, I became a member of the Resources Committee as it has links to my profession as a Finance Business Partner at a local university. I

continue to serve on this committee, meeting every half term to review and discuss many items such as budgets, the policies that fall to the committee, capital projects e.g. new windows, roofs, boilers etc, Health & Safety, spend on Pupil & Sports Premium funding and other topics.

I am also the Chair of the Admissions Committee. One of the main functions of the committee is to annually review and update, where necessary, the Admissions Policy. In recent years we updated the policy to reduce the number of Oversubscription Criteria, simplify the list and thereby making it clearer for future applications to our school. The committee also reviews the applications each year and deals with any appeals or applications for out of year entry.

When I was first approached by the St Peter's Church Parochial Church Council (PCC) to ask if I would be interested in becoming a Governor, I hadn't previously considered doing the role. My wife was a Deputy Head teacher at a primary school and along with talking to others and carrying out some research I was able to get some insight into what the role might involve. The first 6 months to a year was guite a steep learning curve but with the support of others on the Governing Body as well as attending various training courses it became easier. It can be a challenging role but it has been very rewarding and really interesting to see what goes into running a school. It has been a wonderful opportunity to be able to support Mrs Dunning, all the teachers and staff at St Peter's, especially during the last 2, challenging years.

We are of course, covering the situation in Ukraine in our worship sessions at an age appropriate level. We are aware that some families are discussing it a lot as children are eager to start discussions, while other children are not familiar with the situation at all. We need to be aware of this in our interactions with pupils.

# Fairtrade Fortnight



All year groups had a really successful Fairtrade Fortnight. The learning about justice and trade came into many subject areas (including French). Each year, the English curriculum across the school focuses on Fairtrade over the two weeks and teachers never fail to be impressed with the high quality of writing that results. Pupils enjoy learning about something 'real' in today's world, with each year group learning about a different product, ranging from brazil nuts to cotton.

We held two whole school Fairtrade assemblies, there was an outdoor quiz and of course the joy of the Fairtrade Gingerbread sale which raised nearly **£400**. Thank you once again to our families for supporting your children. Hopefully they have been telling something about the Fairtrade mission. Sales of Fairtrade produce were up 20% in the UK in 2020. This year, the message was also around the global climate crisis. We learnt that in the UK, each person consumes 24x the amount of energy as people in some of the countries blighted by floods, droughts and extreme weather. We learnt about how our choices impact others.

# **Nutrition Talk**

We are grateful to Mrs Gold who delivered engaging assemblies on healthy food for both KS1 and KS2. Pupils learnt about different food groups and how to make healthy choices. We hope you are supporting your child with the healthy food challenge that they brought home. This was a fantastic tool to support our Learning for Life curriculum and our recent *Healthy Schools* recognition.

In light of this, we would ask that parents do not bring food for their child at the end of the school day. We have noticed an increasing number of children who are given sweet snacks as soon as they are picked up and before they have a chance to speak. Aside from being unnecessary, it can upset others who are not allowed to have sweets and biscuits at that time. Please could we ask families to keep the treats in the car or to wait until they've arrived home. We do of course have occasional cake sales at school. These are special events which are also fully inclusive.

# Car park etiquette



As you know access into school/nursery for some children is via a car park. We ask that you discuss and make your children aware that extra care should be taken when walking or queuing in the car parks. Vehicles could be moving around at any time and children should be taught that road safety applies within the car parking areas. They are not playgrounds and

should not be used for running about or scootering. Thank you for your co-operation.
