Governors column



Hi, I hope you all had a relaxing Easter break and have settled back into the new term!

I am Bart Caines, a PCC nominated Foundation governor appointed by the Diocesan Board of Education initially in 2017. As a Foundation Governor, I play a particular role in upholding the

Christian character and ethos of the school and ensuring that this is worked out with wisdom, creativity and care through all aspects of school life.

I am co-chair with Neil Ambrose, a role we have shared since September 2021. I have previously worked as Vicechair and chaired the Resources Committee and the Headteachers Appraisal Board.

School governance was a topic I knew very little about — my parents were both teachers and over the years I had picked up snippets but not much.... As Neil said in his profile in the last newsletter, the learning curve is steep but well supported! I really enjoy working closely with the other governors and the school community and I am very proud of everything we have achieved.

Effective Governance is central to school life, with a particular remit of helping schools provide the best possible education for their pupils by:

- *Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- *Holding the head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff
- *Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure money is well spent.

The role of the chair of governors is to:

- *Give the governing body a clear lead and direction, ensuring that the governors work as an effective team and understand their accountability and the part they play in the strategic leadership of the school and in driving school improvement.
- *Build the team by attracting governors with the necessary skills and ensuring that tasks are effectively delegated across the governing body so that all members contribute, and feel that their individual skills, knowledge and experience are well used.
- *Be a critical friend to the Head Teacher by offering support, challenge and encouragement, holding the headteacher to account and ensuring the headteacher's performance management is rigorous and robust
- *Ensure school improvement is the focus of all policy and strategy and that governor scrutiny, monitoring and challenge reflect school improvement priorities.
- *Ensure that statutory requirements and regulations are met, that the school provides value for money in its use of resources and that governing body business is conducted efficiently and effectively

I have a daughter at St Peter's and I am regularly at the school for pick-up. Please feel free to ask any questions you may have or to have a chat about the school!

School items



Please make sure your child comes to school with all the items they need for their school day (PE kit, lunch, book bag, musical instruments, forest school kit etc). We aim to make children independent and responsible for their own items, as well as minimise professional time lost delivering items. There is now a trolley in the lobby to drop off any forgotten items;

they will be distributed at 11am and 1pm only. Please make sure any items dropped off are clearly labelled with your child's name and class. Any unlabelled items will remain in the trolley.

Uniform

The children were reminded in assembly last week that the summer uniform is now acceptable to wear. Uniform is not gender specific. The children do not need to wear a shirt and tie but a school logo polo shirt instead. School shoes are vital and children know they must wear them right up until the end of the school year.

Children were reminded of no earrings at any time, no nail varnish and all long hair must be tied back.

Everyone agreed rules were in place to make it fair in our community and that no-one should break the rule and be allowed to get away with it. Our children showed great maturity in the whole school discussion. Thank you for your support as parents to reinforce the uniform expectations

Request for leave

Please be aware that there will be no more authorised holiday request that are due to delayed plans because of Covid. As disappointing as it has been for families to be disrupted by Covid, we need to make a point in time when we will move back to our policy of no authorised leave unless they are really exceptional circumstances. Children have 13 weeks of holiday a year and 5 additional days due to INSET days. Our attendance target for each pupil is 97% which allows for a few days maximum due to illness. Children below 96% will not have their request authorised. For the last two years the school have been very accommodating in authorising leave due to Covid-related delays. We know we will have your full support to ensure that children get the maximum educational opportunities that they can by ensuring full attendance when they are fit and healthy.
