Step - by- Step #OPEN DOORS



This Aldershot based charity works with young homeless people in the local area. Sadly, there are young people (16-25) in our area who are no longer welcome in their own families. These youngsters usually end up in very difficult situations and are very vulnerable to exploitation. As you might imagine, there are often mental health issues at some point in the chain of

family breakdown. Step- by- Step supports these young people to find suitable shelter and get their lives back on track. We have supported this charity before and our school council at the time had the privilege of visiting their head-quarters and meeting some of the young people. We shall be having an assembly, and after that families will be invited to write a message on an #OPENDOORS tag and tie it onto the school Christmas tree (in exchange for a small donation). The message should be intended for a young person this Christmas and will be collected by Step by Step.
