We have had really positive feedback from the first group of parents to complete the workshop. The content covers Confidence and Stress and is designed to help parents to support their child, using simple strate-

gies. All children experience setbacks and disappointments at times. There are some who are nervous about new situations or even about coming into school and separating from their key adult. There is nothing unusual about these situations but at times, adults feel that they are not effective in helping their child to move forward. These workshops focus on positivity and have been put together to help all parents to reflect on why their child is feeling a certain way and to suggest ways to make small but meaningful changes. They are delivered in small groups in a safe environment and participants only share what they are happy with. There are useful materials to take away and keep. school applications

Please note the deadline for applying for a September 2023 YR place is 15 January 2023.

Surrey strongly encourage online applications via https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/eAdmissions/app. Parents can apply online from a smartphone or tablet as well as a laptop. If parents are unable to apply online, they will need to request a paper application form via the Surrey Schools & Childcare Service (0300 200 1004, Mon-Fri 9am-5pm). The completed paper application form must be received by Admissions (to our Quadrant Court address) by 15 January, so parents must allow time for the post to reach us. If parents need to apply on paper, we recommend that they send applications by recorded post.

Full information is available on Surrey's website at www.surreycc.gov.uk/primaryadmissions. The Surrey Schools & Childcare Service can also provide impartial help in completing an application.

Applications received after the closing date without an exceptional reason will be treated as late and will not be considered until all on time applications have been processed. This may jeopardise the chance of a parent being offered one of their preferred schools for their child.
