On Friday 9th June, Y4 went to Alice Holt Forest to undertake geography field work. The children practiced their mapping skills and collected data about geo-

graphical features. They completed four activities: learning how to use a compass and to follow compass directions; finding a route using a map; measuring length and distances

using trundle wheels and metre rules; identifying geographical features in a given area, including tree identification. Back in the classroom, the children used their skills and data to create simple maps and bar charts. It was a fun day and we were lucky with the weather.
