Grandparents gardening session then enjoying some refreshments and reading time.

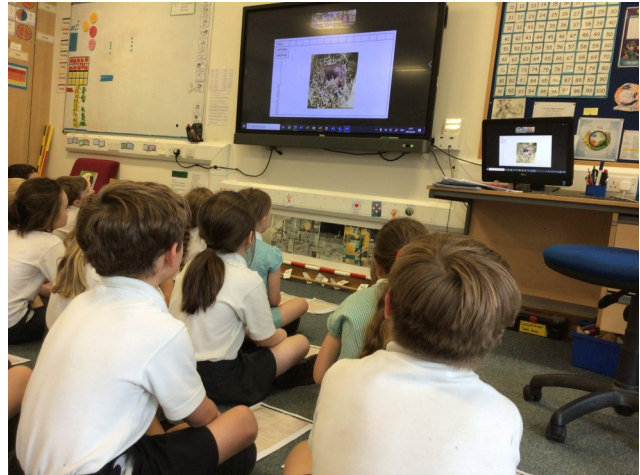
